Developing a Local Vision for Volunteering

Since the national Vision for Volunteering strategy came out, we have discussed developing a local Stoke-on-Trent based vision. We first created a statement as an initial commitment to the Vision for Volunteering:

"Our Vision for Volunteering is to create a community where everyone comes together to make a positive impact. We believe that together we can create meaningful connections, foster empathy, and create a real sense of unity.

We hosted a world café event in March 2023 around the national Vision for Volunteering which helped us to introduce this strategy to local organisations. The feedback from this event, has helped us to shape our local Vision.

We identified four key themes utilising our world café data, and recent volunteering themed events, such as our Volunteer Managers Networks and Volunteer Forums. We felt that these four key themes fit the ethos of volunteering in Stoke-on-Trent.

Celebrating Volunteers and Volunteering	Local Community Connection
Recognise volunteer contributions	Building partnerships
Day to day recognition	Shared resources
Storytelling and awareness	Collaboration platforms
Experimentation and Innovation	Accessible and Inclusive
Feedback loops	Broadening participation
Pilot Projects	Reducing barriers

We discussed these themes at the meeting, and how we can make the Vision as sector-led as possible. We sent a draft of the discussions out with the February meeting invite.

At the February meeting, we will be finalising our Vision for Volunteering!

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T-Levels

T-Levels are linked to an occupation or career path and are made up of 80% classroom learning and 20% 'on the job'. You can see a short video of T-Levels <u>here</u>.

The City of Stoke-on-Trent Sixth Form offer a range of T-Levels ranging from Digital, Health and Science, Education, Business, Legal, Finance and Accounting, Creative and Design and Sales, Marketing and Procurement.

There is a minimum of 315 hours/45 days/9 weeks in the workplace is a **mandatory** requirement of all T level courses. Placement days and week-long blocks are built into the courses.
